As we approach All Saints' Sunday, I am thinking of all the saints gone before, known and unknown to me. Of the saints gone before, I am thinking of Rev. Pauline Wilkins, my mentor and friend—a mother figure, if you will. She taught me everything I know about being a pastor. She preached from the Revised Common Lectionary, using multiple texts each time to tell the story of God's loving care for humanity and the relevance of the story to us in contemporary times. She taught me to care for families to be better as a youth minister while ensuring I spent time learning what it meant to be a United Methodist. While she knew I was avoiding going into ministry, she never prodded or pushed me; she simply showed me what being a pastor meant and what being a pastor was.

I delighted in visiting parishioners with her in their times of loss. I was amazed by the skillful way she helped people walk through their loss, helping them experience God amid their grief. I participated in leading funerals and life celebrations with her. She had a way of gently recognizing the loss while assuredly teaching about life beyond death, the continuation of the eternal life promised by our Lord. She was incredibly skilled in making sick visits. This saint of the church is the greatest human reason I am a pastor today.

As you go through November, take some time to remember the saints, those with us, and those gone before. Celebrate the memories of times past; celebrate the memories you are making now. And live into the great legacies to which you have been privy.
